SHORT HISTORY

The Academy of High Commercial and Industrial Studies, the first name of the country's first economic university, was established on April 6, 1913 by the Royal Decree signed by King Carol I.

The University's activity was based on the Law on the Establishment of the Academy of High Commercial and Industrial Studies promulgated by Royal Decree No. 2978 of April 6, 1913, and the Regulation for the organization and administration of the Academy of High Commercial and Industrial Studies, promulgated by Royal Decree No. 5498 of August 30, 1913.

The entire responsibility, but also the full credit, for the drafting of the Law establishing the Academy under the auspices of the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, went to the then Minister Nicolae D. Xenopol, the one who demonstrated to the public, despite political opposition, the usefulness of and necessity for such an institution of higher economic education. Young economists, trained in prestigious European universities, were part of the drafting commission of the Law establishing the Academy, together with specialists from institutions such as the Bucharest Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the National Bank, the Marmorosch Blank & Co. Bank, the School of State Sciences, the Higher School of Commerce: Ion Raducanu, Stanislas Cihoski, Aristide Blank, M. Bratila, D. Comsa, D. H. Hagi-Teodorachy, G. I. Juvara, Chr. D. Staicovici.

In 1967, the University received the name of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies.

dedication and commitment of the academic and administrative staff and students, the institution is today a research intensive university, institutionally accredited by ARACIS (the Romanian Agency for Quality Assurance in Higher Education) with a "High Degree of Confidence", a leading player on the educational market in Romania and abroad - as evidenced by its positioning in prestigious international rankings, as well as by its being an unfailing partner for the business environment, a fact proven by ASE's good reputation among employers and the very good degree of insertion of graduates on the labor market.

The inauguration of the University, initially with three faculties, took place on November 1, 1913, with Professor Anton Davidoglu, a mathematician of international reputation, as the first Rector. On ASE's 110th Anniversary, through the effort,

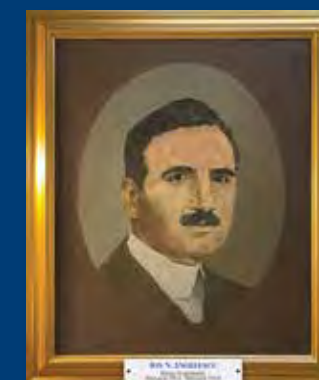

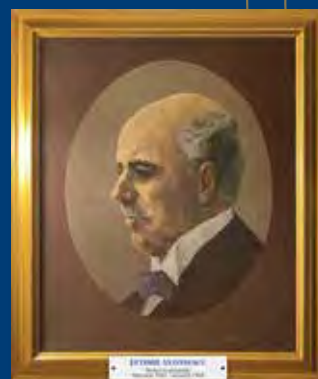

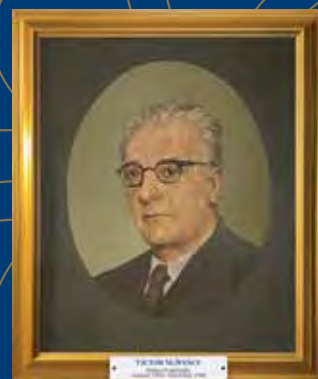

Research activities

Today, the Bucharest University of Economic Studies is the leader of economic and public administration higher education in Romania and South-Eastern Europe. The international visibility of ASE's research activity is certified primarily by articles published in Web of Science and/or Scopus indexed journals and by the visibility and impact of research measured by citations. The activities carried out in the last 10 years by ASE's entire academic community resulted in:

over 3,000 articles published in Web of Science indexed journals;

over 2,700 articles published in Scopus indexed journals;

over 4,500 studies published in Web of Science indexed international conference volumes;

more than 800 studies published in Scopus indexed international conference volumes;

over 52,000 citations, out of which over 46,000 excluding self-citations;

over EUR 16 million attracted through financing contracts;

over 30 international projects, including 14 projects financed by the European Union, 7 projects funded as part of the Horizon 2020 or Horizon Europe frameworks.

For example, the research activities carried out in 2021 by ASE's entire academic community consisted in the publication of articles in Web of Science journals or in journals indexed in international databases, and the publication of books in prestigious publishing houses, as follows:

419 articles published in Web of Science indexed journals;

388 articles published in Scopus indexed journals;

113 papers published in the Web of Science indexed international conference volumes;

27 papers published in Scopus indexed international conference volumes;

6 books, 25 book chapters published by prestigious international publishing houses (Springer, Palgrave Macmillan, IGI Global, Routhledge, Filodirito Publisher) and 7 books and 22 book chapters published by other international publishing houses;

30 books published by national publishing houses, other than ASE's Publishing House;

40 books published by ASE's Publishing House.

Moreover, 49 research projects were implemented through various national and international programs, amounting to 10,934,471.35 RON.

In 2021, expenses for participation of papers in prestigious international conferences were covered for 68 researchers from ASE. Of these, 45 participations of academic staff and researchers were supported from the special budget allocated by ASE, amounting to 75,397.80 RON, and 23 participations were financed from the budgets of research centers and/or through scientific research projects, amounting to 24,864.75 RON.

ASE ranks first in Romania and 157th out of over 900 universities evaluated in THE Emerging Economies University Rankings 2022.

ASE is strengthening its international prestige through its constant presence in leading world academic rankings, such as Times Higher Education and QS World University Rankings. For the fifth consecutive year, ASE is present in the Times Higher Education World University Ranking 2023, which includes 1799 research universities. ASE is ranked 1st in Romania, for the fourth consecutive time and the 501-600th worldwide, for the second consecutive year.

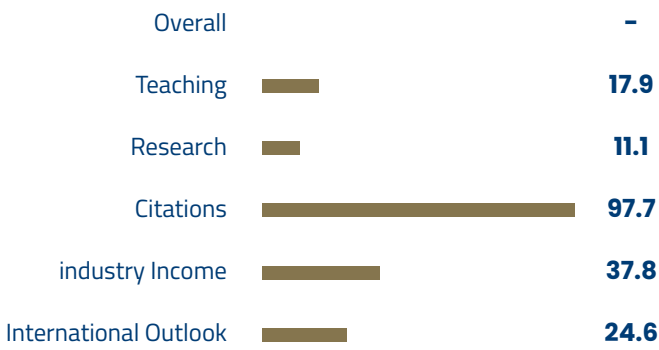

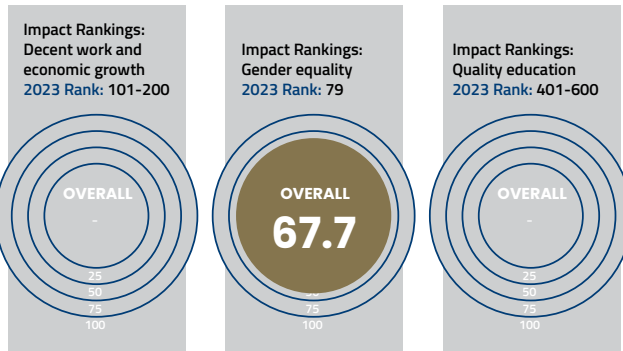
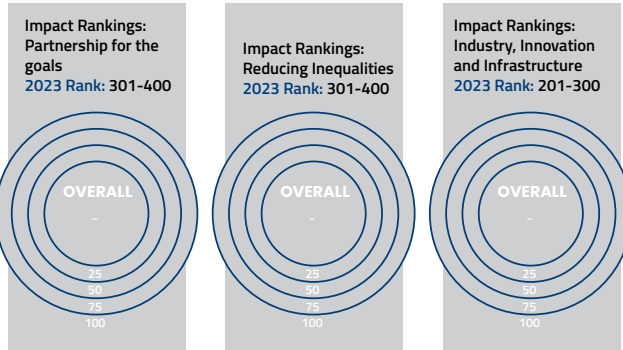
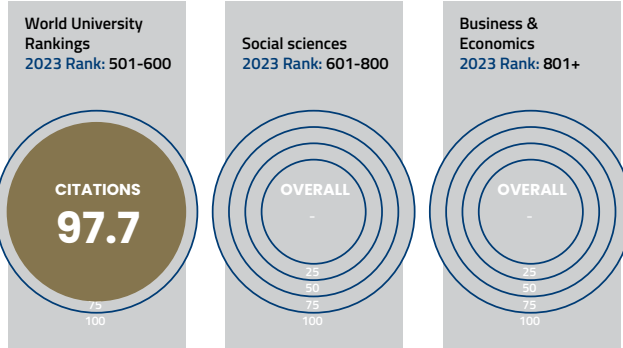
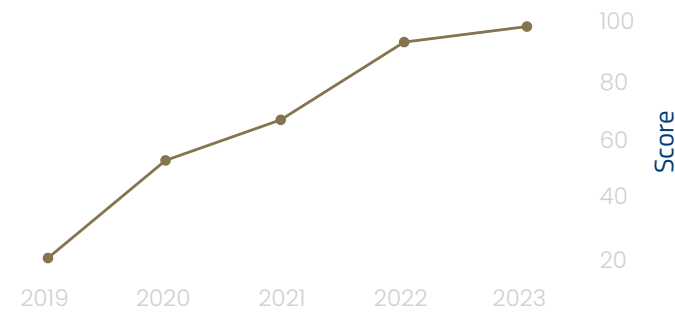


WORLD UNIVERSITY RANKINGS

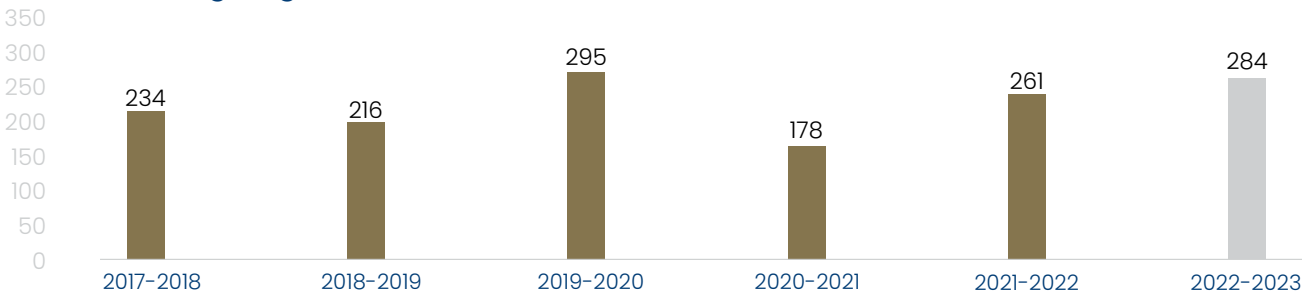
ASE has concluded 330 bilateral agreements with partners from 45 countries.

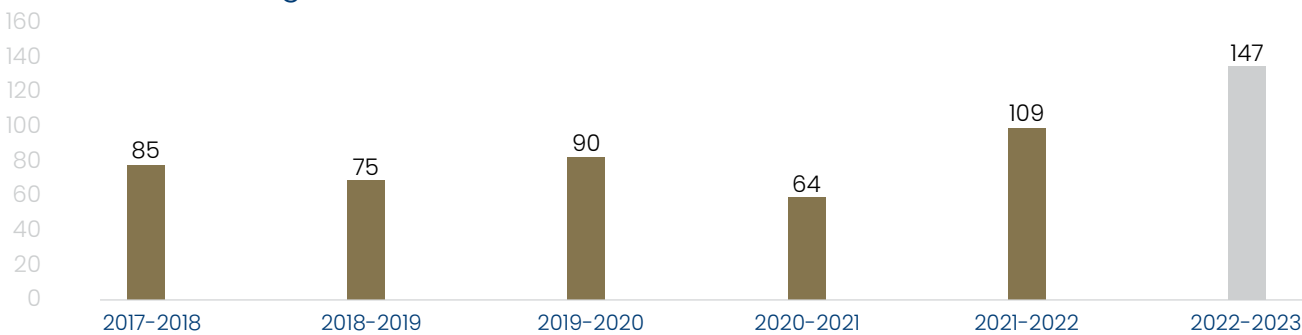
Furthermore, the preparation process for obtaining AACSB international accreditation continues at an accelerated pace.

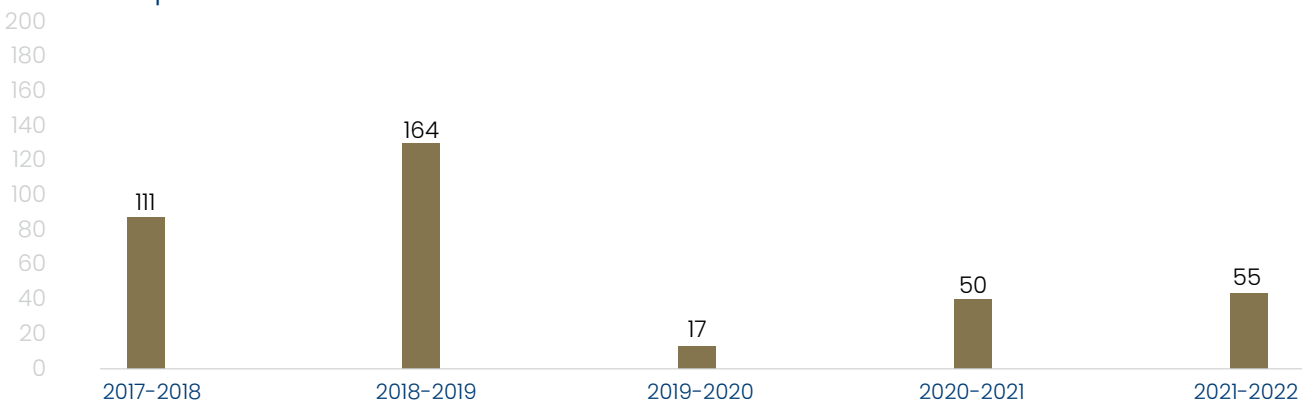
Trends in outgoing mobilitiest

Trends in placement mobilities

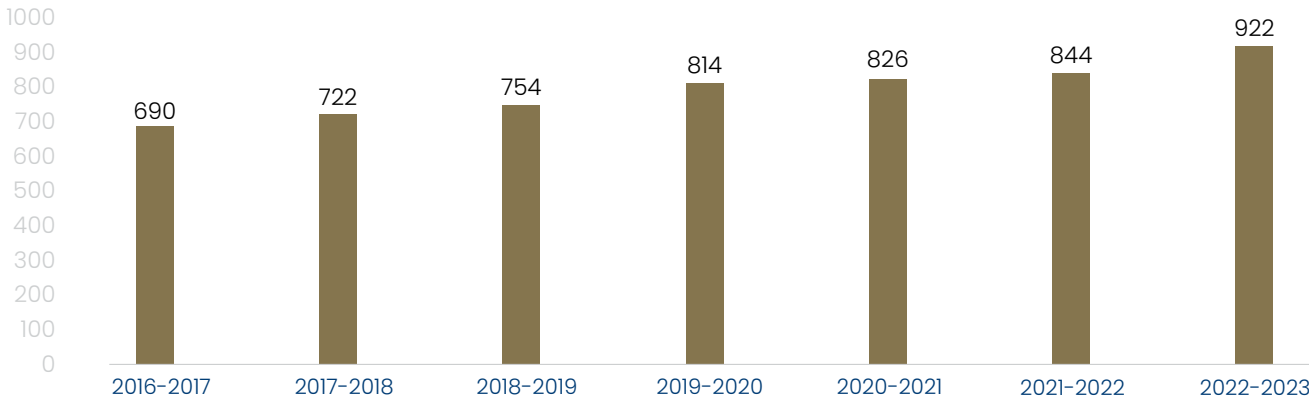

As a result of international promotion efforts, as well as of the increase in the international prestige of our university, through its constant presence in the most prestigious world rankings, **922 foreign students** are currently registered at ASE.

Trends in the number of international students in the period 2016–2022



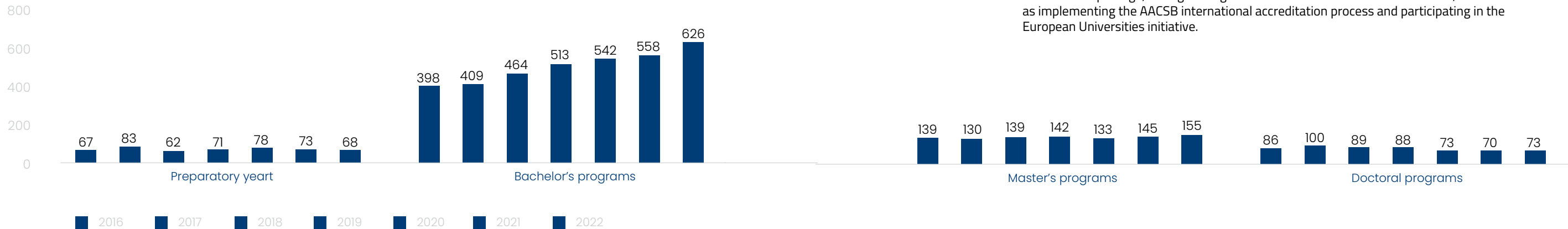
The community of international students who attend full university studies at ASE is made up of students of 40 nationalities, thus significantly contributing to the internationalization of the academic community.

Most international students come from the Republic of Moldova (about 45%), Morocco, Tunisia, Albania, Turkey, Ukraine, Iraq (ranging from 1.9% to 5.2% each).

ASE's Cultural Studies Centers - the Center for American Studies (established in 2017), the Center for Japanese Studies (established in 2019) and the Center for Francophone Studies (CRU ASE established in 2015), carry out specific activities that make a notable contribution to the intensification of the University's internationalization process.

Over the past seven years, over 700 international events have taken place, among which we mention: 7 editions of the International Week in ASE, 7 editions of the International Knowledge Fair, 5 editions of the Internationalization Think Tank, Accreditation Summer Camp, Open Days Caravans. The external travel procedure was digitized and the "out of papers" program has been implemented by ASE's Erasmus+ Office.

The internationalization process will continue to focus on increasing the University's international prestige, strengthening internationalization at home and abroad, as well as implementing the AACSB international accreditation process and participating in the European Universities initiative.



PARTNERSHIPS WITH THE BUSINESS ENVIRONMENT

Over time, ASE has aimed at the consolidation and conclusion of strategic agreements with the economic and social environment, on the following essential aspects: the development of physical and digital infrastructure, offering study programs adapted to the current and prospective needs of companies, offering annual internships and other career development programs for students, conducting applied research projects and implementing their results, organizing joint business events, or providing consulting services for the economic and social environment. Since 2016, the main concern has been the development of the University's infrastructure. Among the most important investments we can mention:

Modernization of BCR I Amphitheater (Funder: BCR);

Modernization of the ING 3M1 Amphitheater (Funder: ING Romania);

Modernization of the Romgaz 2103 Amphitheater (Funder: S.N.G.N Romgaz S.A);

Modernization of the Garrett 2204 Amphitheater (Funder: Garrett Motion Romania);

The launch of the Microsoft Laboratory equipped with Artificial Intelligence (Funder: Microsoft Romania);



Another important direction pursued has been the support of excellence within ASE, through the annual organization of ASE's Gala of Excellence, during which 9 professors/students/members of the administrative staff and 1 company are bestowed awards for having carried out complex activities in the area of research,

education and learning, volunteering etc.

Moreover, ASE has concluded over 200 partnerships and agreements with commercial companies, associations or institutions in Romania. Among the most important objectives of the partnerships, we mention the following:

These partnerships and investments have been undertaken for the members of the academic community, by ASE's Division for Liaison with the business environment and ASE's Foundation, with the support of the University's management team, as well as of ASE's 13 Faculties.

Organization of programs intended for ASE's students with the aim of informing, educating and supporting the latter in their professional career;

Obtaining professional practice and private scholarships for ASE students;

Creating the framework for initiating joint projects and/or capitalizing on research results;

Participation of business specialists in courses and conferences organized by faculties.

6 Piata Romana and 2-10 Caderea Bastiliei Street

The Bucharest University of Economic Studies is a promoter of cultural knowledge and respect for Beauty. ASE's Palace is a heritage building, built between 1924-1926 in a central city point, Piata Romana.

The construction works of ASE's Palace were carried out under the coordination of leading architects Grigore Cerchez and Ed. Van Saanen-Algi, who have managed to give us a Palace characterized by technical perfection, elegance and robustness, to last for centuries.

The first building of ASE's Palace was built between 1924-1926, in Piata Lascar Catargiu, today Piata Romana, and between 1932-1933 the famous fresco entitled "The History of Romanian Trade" was made by artist Cecilia Cutescu-Storck in the Aula Magna of the Palace. In 1935, the Library Building was inaugurated, the second building of the Palace, attached to the first, and in 1940, the third building was inaugurated - the Building of the Commercial Museum and of the Commercial Bureau.

In the Aula Magna from ASE's Palace, we can admire the largest one-piece mural painting - the fresco entitled "History of Romanian Commerce" or "History of Romanian Trade", made by Cecilia Cutescu-Storck between 1922-1923. The fresco is the focal point in the Aula Magna - with an area of 100 square meters, it is "read" on a spiral, from top to bottom, representing the story of trade throughout the ages – sea trade, then trade facilitated by the use of wagons in the time of Alexander the Good, later commerce held in the

Romanian fairs and, finally, the beginnings of grain and timber exports.

In the lower part of the painting, which constitutes the foreground and at the same time the final scene, the author depicts, on the right side, a scene of home industry, by presenting some peasants handing Romanian carpets and embroideries over to sailors to take them abroad, and on the left side scenes such as fishing and grape picking, symbolizing the richness of Romanian waters and vineyards. The work was inaugurated

on the occasion of the celebration of the 20th Anniversary since the establishment of the Academy of High Commercial and Industrial Studies in Bucharest (1933).

Moreover, in the Aula Magna there are multiple decorations covered with gold leaf and two busts made from white Ruschita marble by one of the most famous contemporary Romanian sculptors, Adrian Pirvu - the busts represent Virgil Madgearu and Ion N. Angelescu, fervent supporters of the development of economic sciences in our country and professors at the Academy in the 1920s.

In 2006, after a visit to the Bucharest University of Economic Studies, Jeremy Howard included photos and descriptions (received from ASE) of the fresco in the book entitled "East European Art", from the "Oxford History of Art" Collection. In 2022, following its full restoration begun in the fall of 2021, the mural was again unveiled.

ASE's Palace hosts the Rector's Office, the headquarters of the Board of Trustees and the University's Senate, as well as the following rooms of interest to the student community: the Aula Magna, BCR I Amphitheater, Amphitheater II, Amphitheater III, ASE's Library "Victor Slavesco", "Paul Bran" and "Ion Raducanu" Reading rooms, and 3 gyms.

Since 2007, ASE's Palace hosted the "Cecilia Cutescu-Stork" Art Gallery, which organizes temporary exhibitions of well-known artists from Romania and abroad. ASE has a beautiful constantly enlarging art collection, which includes works by established artists such as: Sabin Balasa, Ilie Boca, Dan Bota, Gheo Vlad Botan, Cecilia Cutescu-Storck, Michaela Eleuteriade, Vasile Grigore, Viorel Marginean, Ovidiu Pastina, Adrian Pirvu, Silvia Radu, Ion Salisteanu, Sorin Scurtulescu, Margareta Sterian and many others. ASE honors its Rectors through the "ASE's Rectors' Gallery", located on the monumental staircase of ASE's Palace, and the "Gallery of Economics Personalities", exhibited in the same building.

In ASE's Library, located in ASE's Palace, we can admire two well-known frescoes by artist Sabin Balasa: "Genesis" and "Enchantment", as well as works by many other artists, whose works have been exhibited as part of the project entitled "ASE's Painters".

The “Nanu Muscel” House

The “Nanu Muscel” Building belonged to PhD Prof. Ion Nanu-Muscel (1862-1938) and his wife Ana, being built in 1890, in the composite style of the time, which combines elements of the Louis XV and Louis XVI styles, in the manner of architect I. D. Berindey-the son. Purchased by ASE in 2012, it has recently been consolidated and restored, the works being carried out by certified experts in the restoration of historical monuments.

It is a space intended for culture, which from 2023 hosts ASE’s Museum, the “Cecilia Cutescu-Stork” Art Gallery and various spaces for cultural and artistic activities.

Considering its value and destination, ASE intends to include the building in the cultural circuit of the Capital City of Romania.

The Museum of the Bucharest University of Economic Studies was inaugurated in April 2013, on the occasion of ASE’s Centennial Anniversary. The first headquarters of ASE’s Museum was on the 1st floor of ASE’s Palace, which hosted old documents about ASE, as well as cultural events – round tables, debates, book launches, interviews with special guests.

Since April 2023, when the University celebrates 110 years since its foundation, ASE’s Museum is hosted by the “Nanu-Muscel” House in 7 Piata Romana, a historical building representative of the architecture of the city of Bucharest from the beginning of the 20th century. The building has been recently restored, according to its original blueprints and preserving the interior decorations.

The Museum patrimony includes unpublished manuscripts of the founding fathers of our institution, very rare books, objects that belonged to personalities who were connected with the University, pieces of furniture that have been in ASE’s patrimony since the time of its foundation, trophies obtained in recognition of the high level of the educational process. Moreover, ASE’s Museum has in its inventory an impressive art gallery, whose pieces were obtained during the 110 years of activity through donations and purchases.

It comprises the works of important visual artists from the recent past and present, both painters and sculptors, such as: Sava Hentia, Henri Catargi, Margareta Sterian, Silvia Radu, Viorel Marginean, Ioan Ladea, etc. They will be displayed in a permanent exhibition.

The Museum has been conceived as a living space that combines the display of historical artefacts and art with cutting-edge technology such as virtual reality or audio-video devices. Symposiums, conferences, concerts and exhibition openings for the works of contemporary artists are to be organized in this dedicated space.



Located near ASE's Palace, the "Sabba Stefanescu" House - an Art Nouveau building - was built in 1903 according to the plans of architect Oscar Maugsch.

Pursuing the mission of promoting scientific, cultural and ethical values at national and international level, the Bucharest University of Economic Studies wants to provide current and future generations

with a modern logistical and professional space for education and research, with optimal conditions for the implementation of national and international partnerships, attractive for students, teachers, researchers and other categories of members of our academic community.

The purchase of the new building in November 2022 allows the administrative structures of the institution to be concentrated around ASE's Palace, thus contributing to ensuring the efficiency, effectiveness and economy of the administrative processes of our university.

The renovation of the building started in November 2021, as part of a project included in the National Program for Constructions of Public or Social Interest, run by the National Investment Company, an institution under the authority of the Ministry of Public Works, Development and Administration.

Following its complete restauration, the "Mihai Eminescu" Building, erected over 50 years ago, will become a high-performance educational space, at the highest standards of safety and functionality, with amphitheatres, laboratories and related spaces equipped with ultramodern furniture and computing technology, which will give a higher quality to the teaching process.

The “Virgil Madgearu” Building hosts the headquarters of the Faculty of Economic Cybernetics, Statistics and Informatics and the Faculty of Theoretical and Applied Economics, as well as the

The “Paul Bran” Building

5-7 Mihail Moxa Street

The building hosts the headquarters of the Faculty of Agrifood and Environmental Economics and the Faculty of Finance and Banking, as well as the Department of Academic Staff Training and the Center for Career Counseling and Guidance.

The construction of the building began in 2001, during the mandate of Rector, PhD Prof. Paul Bran. Between 2020-2023, Building C2 (B) was consolidated and rehabilitated, offering modern rooms for lectures and seminars, a dedicated room for a high-density data center, office spaces for teaching, research and administrative staff.

In the immediate vicinity, in the “Mihail Moxa” Complex, there are dormitories, medical and dental offices, the Moxa Canteen, especially designed for students, with affordable good quality food.

Here are the headquarters of the Faculty of Business Administration in Foreign Languages, and the Faculty of Bucharest Business School. The Ernst & Young Amphitheater is also located here.

The building was erected in 1905 and is classified as a historical monument, having been restored and consolidated between 2007-2010.

Currently, it is the only building in Romania that is protected against earthquakes by means of the “base isolation” method, being, therefore, one of the safest in the country.

Since 2005, the building bears the name of Academician Victor Slavescu (1891-1977), one of the best-known

economists of the Interwar period, also a Liberal politician, professor at the Academy of High Commercial and Industrial Studies, its Rector in 1944, and member of the Romanian Academy.

Inaugurated in September 2017, the construction began in 2009 and required a sustained effort to be completed to the most modern standards. The building has spaces intended for business incubators, for research projects won through competition, reading rooms and accommodation facilities for students.

The Faculty of Business and Tourism and the Faculty of International Business and Economics are located here, as well as the Postgraduate School of Continuous Professional Training and Development, and the Institute for Doctoral Studies.

The building was acquired by ASE in 1990, during the mandate of Rector PhD Prof. Constantin Barbulescu.

The Bucharest University of Economic Studies offers its students over 5,000 accommodation places in the best conditions in 12 dormitories in the following city areas:

The Moxa Complex, the Old Belvedere Complex, the New Belvedere Complex, the Agronomie Complex, the Vitan Dormitory, the Tei C1 Complex.



Student Dormitories

Inaugurated in November 2017, the building is named after PhD Prof. Ion Gh. Rosca, ASE's Rector between 2004-2012.

It offers accommodation and dining facilities.

The Center hosts a modern center for teaching activities, conferences, national and international scientific debates.

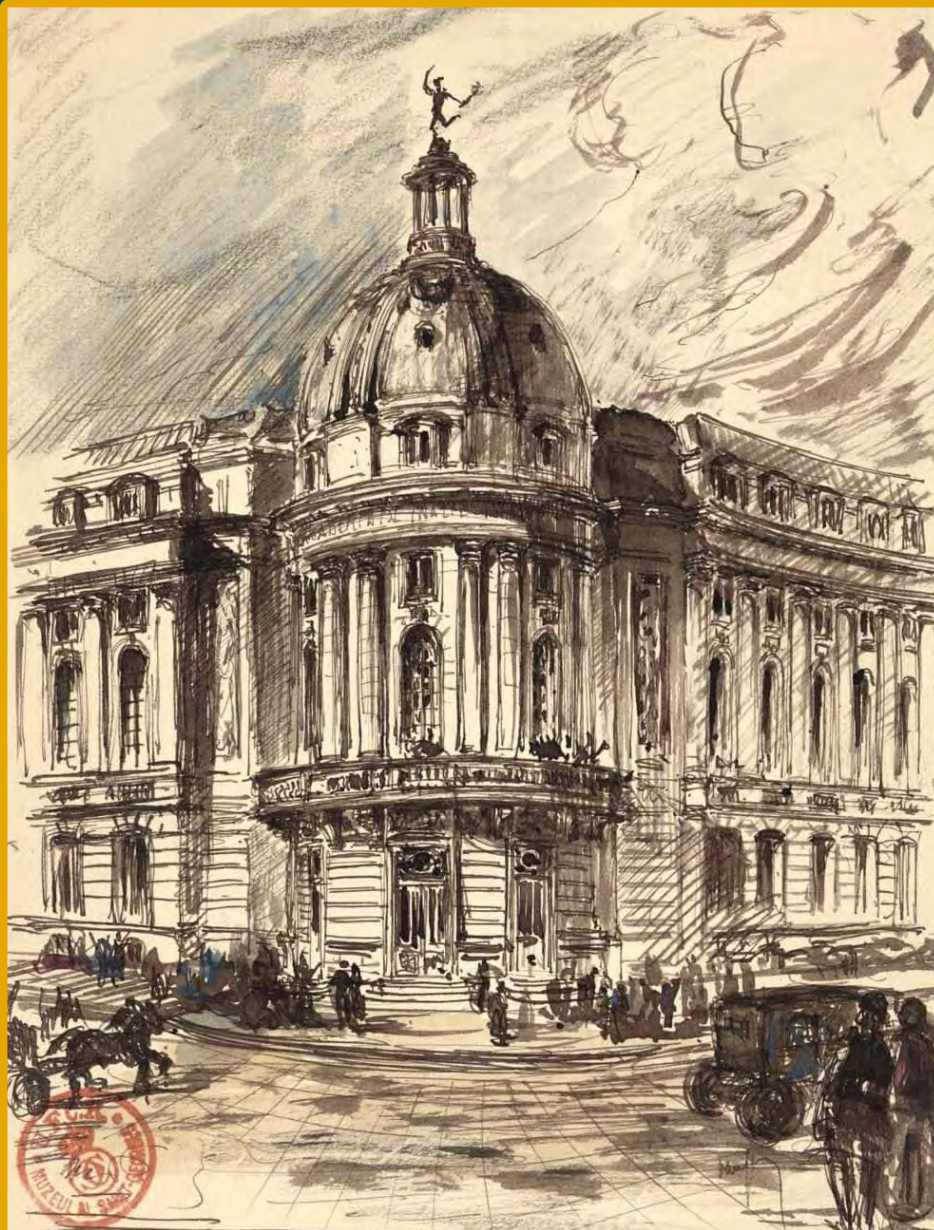
